

1. AMERICAN HORTICULTURAL ANNUAL, A Year-Book of Horticultural Progress for the Professional and Amateur Gardener, Fruit-Grower and Florist. 64 engraved text figures. pp.iv,(5-)152,xvi-adverts, [2-adverts. printed on blue paper]. Pebbled cloth, gilt-titled spine. NY 1869. Orange Judd & Co.

Spine faded, joints chipped, water-stain on upper inner margins, signature of Geo. F. Wheeler on rear endpaper. Wheeler (1824-1903) was a Wisconsin pioneer and businessman who served as a Wisconsin state senator for four years.

First issued in 1867, this annual publication describes the horticultural news for 1869 including new fruits, vegetables, evergreens, flowers, implements, horticultural publications, etc. Includes a listing by state of active nurseries and seed establishments. Good.

Fine new copy, issued without DJ. In original shrink wrap. John Bartram (1699-1777) was a horticulturist, explorer and one of the most influential botanists in this country. He founded the first botanical garden here just outside of Philadelphia and corresponded with other botanists in England and Europe sharing both seeds and observations with them. This work contains the most comprehensive collection of Bartram's correspondence to date. In addition to the 298 letters found in Darlington's 1849 work (The Memorials of John Bartram and

Humphry Marshall), it includes 300 additional letters to and from Bartram. correspondence between Bartram and Peter Collinson in England is of special interest in this collection, but William Bartram, Mark Catesby, John Clayton, John Gronovius, Carolus Linnaeus, Peter Kalm, Philip Miler, Jane Colden, Sir Hans Sloane, Benjamin Franklin and many others make their appearance as well. With a glossary of names mentioned in the letters, and a bibliography. By the veteran biographers Edmund and Dorothy Berkeley. \$20.00

Contains descriptions of flowers plus their symbolic meanings and lore. With its color engravings, this is not only a nice gift item, but it is also a good source for visualizing the flowers grown in the early part of the 19th century. Moses Cook was the gardener to Arthur Capel, Earl of Essex, where his skillful accomplishments there utilizing geometry and mathematics in his plantings were praised by John Evelyn, author of the influential Sylva, or a Discourse of Forest-Trees (1664). Cook was also one of the founders, along with Henry Wise and George London, of the Brompton Park Nursery. This popular work on raising forest trees was first published in 1676 and contains much detailed information on cultivation, planting



and raising of various kinds trees as well as their use in designing walks and avenues. A third edition was published in 1724. \$650.00




Johann Hermann Knoop (1700-1769) was born in Germany, the son of a court gardener, who later became the head gardener at the Dowager Prin-

cess of Orange's estate, Marienburg, near Leeuwar-

den, Holland, where he oversaw vast fruit plantations. He lost his employment there apparently from alcohol abuse which arose as a result of his experiments in the distillation of gin from various fruits. He then began work as an author, mainly of botanical books. The Pomologia describes and illustrates apples and pears available in Holland, England, France and Germany. The Fructologia describes



primarily stone fruits, but also includes grapes and some other fruits. Knoop hoped that both titles would help with the identification of cultivars and facilitate improvement in selection. These titles were among the first fruit books to be illustrated with colored plates. Because his approach to the study of these fruits was so systematic and scientific, he is known as the "father of scientific pomology." The plates, based on Knoop's drawings, were engraved by Jacob Folkema and Jan Casper Philips; the colorists were the daughters of the publisher, Abraham Ferwerda. The third title, Dendrologia, was unillustrated and treats of trees and landscape design. The plates in this copy are exceptionally clean and vibrant. A very good copy of a very early – and lovely – color plate fruit book. \$4,500.00





This is a later edition of Huish's A Treatise on the Nature, Economy, & Practical Management of Bees, which was first published in 1815 with a second edition published in 1817. Almost thirty years later, two "new editions" were issued: the one offered here, published in 1842, which is less common, and another in 1844. Robert Huish (1777 - 1850) was a prolific author, primarily of histories, but his treatise on bee culture stands as his major work as he was an experienced bee keeper and corresponded with the British and European beekeepers of the day. In this work, he argues vigorously (and at times erroneously) against the Swiss apiculturist Francis Huber's theories regarding the behavior and management of bees. \$250.00

Miss Martin states in the preface that she knows she's a small business owner but she gives her undivided attention to her customers. She also notes: "I am in no way whatsoever connected with any other seed or floral establishment doing business at Floral Park," written perhaps to distinguish her business from

that of John Lewis Childs, also located in Floral Park, NY. VG. \$40.00

Engraved bookplate of Rachel McMasters Miller Hunt (of the Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation). This copy is apparently from the AUTHOR'S LIBRARY, with his printed bookplate stating "Ferniebield Library. Better a wee bush than nae bield" (a quote from another Scotsman, Robert

Burns, signifying that it's better to have a small bush than no shelter at all.) "Ferniebield" was the name of the property on which J. P. Haig, author of *Common Sense in the Poultry Yard* raised the poultry he describes in the book. That work was published in NY 1885 by the Industrial Publication Company (a publication house Phin was instrumental in organizing). Interestingly, Haig's book's copyright page



notes that it was "Entered According to Act of Congress, in the Year 1885 by John Phin." The author's signature is reproduced on the bookplate.

John Phin (1832-1913) was a Scottish author and publisher as well as a Shakespearian scholar who wrote a number of books on subjects as diverse as grape culture, the microscope, mechanics, applied science and Shakespeare. He emigrated to the United States in 1852 where he taught physics and chemistry. The work offered here is a practical treatise culled from information scattered within periodicals and other works of the day, as well as from the practice wisdom of other cultivators; it includes a 5pp. bibliography of works relating to the vine. The book was first issued in 1862, then republished in 1863, 1867 and again in this final edition in 1876, which is more scarce than the other editions. Phin includes a 5pp. bibliography of works relating to the vine; a 4pp. section on the "Ohio Vineyard System" and a 12pp. section on wine making.

A very good, bright copy. Nice gift item for the budding viticulturist.


A presentation sheet <u>signed by the author</u> to Mr. Fred W. Thorne is tipped in on the front endpaper.

The author, the Rev. J. H. Simmonds (1845-1936), was a well known silviculturist in New Zealand who contributed a number

of articles to the forestry journals published in that country. In this work, descriptions of over 70 species of eucalypts are arranged by thermometric group, i.e., by the mean and extreme temperatures in which they can be grown. The author also includes an alphabetical listing of all known eucalypt species. A VG copy. \$100.00




First published in two volumes in 1735, this work was revised and reissued a number of times throughout the 18th century. Arranged in a dictionary format, many of the entries on specific animals are basically essays



on their subjects (e.g., hare, hart, pheasant, plover, and rabbets [sic]) and include methods for capturing them. Other entries concern the care of hunting animals like dogs and horses, and topics such as game-laws, angling, and bait. An unusual gift for the sportsman in your life! \$200.00

Pierre le Lorrain de Vallemont (1649-1721) was a physician, natural philosopher and writer who first published this work on the wonders of plants in Paris 1705. It is taken principally from earlier authors, and contains chapters on a variety of topics including plant anatomy, trees, saltpeter, plant propagation, the management of the fruit and flower garden, etc. An English translation appeared in 1707. \$225.00

Charles Willis Ward (1856-1920) was an entrepreneur and conservationist. He was President of the Cottage Garden Nursery Co. on Long Island, NY, where he specialized in growing carnations. His interest in both carnations and peonies led him to help establish both the American Carnation



(24 - cont.) Society and the American Peony Society. The work offered here describes the growing requirements for carnations, including soils, greenhouse cultivation, raising carnations from seed, propagation, etc. Ward also includes portraits and biographies of other growers, with summations of the growing conditions in different areas of the country. \$35.00





With typed letter signed from Richardson Wright on his House & Garden letterhead dated 5 July [1934] tipped in on front paste down endpaper: "Dear Mrs. [A. T.] Moore: The weighty tome has arrived, been inscribed and will go back to you today. Thank you so much for selecting this for Mrs. Gibbs - I only hope she doesn't drop it on her toes! My memory of Staunton is one of the things that makes life bearable in this dreary town of New York. Salute(?) my friends for me. Trustfully(?) Yours Richardson Wright." A short newspaper article on Richardson is laid in as well.

Richardson Wright (1887-1961) was a well-known and prolific early 20th century horticultural writer. He also edited the journal House & Garden from 1914 to 1946. Leta Watts Gibbs (1884-1970) created scrapbooks focusing on the history of Staunton, VA (the birthplace of Woodrow Wilson) and the Augusta Garden Club among other subjects. Fifteen of her scrapbooks are housed in the Augusta County Historical Society archives. Interesting association copy and nice gift for a garden historian. \$100.00

The preface states that this encyclopedia contains 6,000 genera of plants and "it concentrates its attention on giving, in the most condensed form consistent with clearness, information on propagation, soil, general culture, and the best species or varieties, adding, in respect to the last, their height, flowering period, degree of hardiness, and the colour of their flowers." It also contains some entries on garden operations and implements. Wright (1864-1940) was an author of a number of popular and useful gardening works. The encyclopedia originally appeared in serial form and was first bound in two volumes in 1902. This 1913 edition is identical to that one except it adds a 48pp. "Appendix" containing additional plants and includes one more color plate and a few more b&w illustrations. \$50.00
