



This is the third in our series of catalogues reflecting changing market conditions in the bookselling world. As in the previous two catalogues, you will find here drastic reductions in the prices of many of our titles, this being the result of several market trends: increasingly, people are using the internet rather than consulting books to answer their gardening questions; secondly, the availability of online digitized books means that information can be obtained without the need for actually owning a copy of a particular title; and finally, the impression given by the search results of numerous bookselling websites that there are scads of copies of any book one would want at any time one would want it have all contributed to a general depression in the prices for many titles. As a result, we have reduced our prices across the board and are now issuing this third in our series of "<u>bargain priced</u>" book catalogues.

We hope that you will enjoy reading through the catalogue and picking out some nice items for yourself. Featured in this catalogue are several early 19th century encyclopedias, a number of early 20th century Japanese flower arranging titles and a section on language of flower books. After the author's death in 1771, the work was revised by Thomas Martyn, a botanist and professor at Cambridge, and published from 1795 to 1807 as The Gardener's and Botanist's Dictionary; it is sometimes identified as the "9th edition." Henrey quotes Gorham (Memoirs of ... Thomas Martyn, 1830) as saying that this 9th edition was "an entirely new work, founded on Miller's as its basis." The dictionary, printed in two columns, is arranged alphabetically by plant, with entries giving botanical descriptions, habitat, propagation, culture and where available information on the place and date of introduction. 


